There has been some encouraging steps taken in our Assisted Living as the result of Governor DeSantis' order in changes in visitation. The Meadows and the Vistas will begin supervised visitation on September 25th in their beautiful outdoor courtyards, provided there are no positive test results during the two-week testing period prior to that date. Resident families have been made aware of the process for this long-awaited event. We are also enjoying communal dining again with the proper social distancing throughout the community.

We continue to follow the guidelines put forth by the CDC and the state regarding testing and other required procedures, but there is a sense of a return to normalcy.

We are extremely proud and blessed at our resident test results for COVID-19 to date. That said, we recognize that continued safe practices that have been followed must continue with vigilance in order to ensure the safety of our staff and your loved ones. While visitation at the Water's Edge independent homes is open, it is important to remember that all visitors must participate in and pass the screening at the front concierge desk.

As previously stated, please rest assured that we have multiple contingency plans prepared in the event that a resident's test is positive, which include in-house isolation or a transfer to a COVID-19 unit in Lee County based on severity of the symptoms. We are also well stocked with necessary personal protection equipment (PPE).

COVID-19 Precautions:

- Visitation to assisted living & memory care is supervised and will commence on September 25th. For information on this, you may call the front desk at: 239-237-0501
- All visitors to the independent living apartments must be screened at the concierge desk
- Mandatory testing of all AHCA roster staff every two weeks
- Enhanced handwashing and cleaning of all surfaces and common areas continues
- All staff are required to wear masks at all times while on campus
- Staff continues to entrance through a manned checkpoint station with Covid-19 screening and temperature checks in place

We must ask out of respect for your fellow residents and our staff as well as for your own protection, **that all residents please wear masks when in public spaces both on and off campus.**
